COURSE DEPOSITS / COURSE PAYMENTS / REFUNDS

Registration fees are non-refundable. COMPLETION OF HOMEWORK AND QUIZ

All work given by the teacher needs to be completed in a timely manner. If requested to re-do any written work the student needs to comply. Failure to complete all required work will automatically exempt the student from receiving a certificate / diploma from our school. Late work will not be corrected as per the document "Week structure".

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR INTERNS

It is your responsibility to respect the traditions and customs of the Ayurvedic practitioner facilitating the clinic. As a former student, now an intern, enrolled in a professional program, you are expected to abide by the code of conduct established by the professional bodies that accredited/recognized the program.

PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

You are a representative of your future profession and are therefore expected to act and behave in a professional manner at all times. Remember that for the patient, the therapeutic process begins as soon as they decide to make an appointment, long before they enter the clinic. Your approach to patients should always be professional, caring, empathetic and non-judgmental.

PRESENCE

To meet the OdA-AM requirements, 95% of the clinical training hours must be completed, as stated in the WHO benchmark for Āyurveda training (2010). It is the responsibility of each student to ensure that their attendance record is signed by the clinical instructor at the end of each session/day. It is also your responsibility to ensure that all documents in the clinical record are completed and signed where applicable.

APPEARANCE

A successful practice requires that your personal appearance represent high standards of professional training and hygiene. Most patients prefer a more professional approach. We ask that student interns adhere to the following appearance code:

- Dress in a clean and elegant (but not necessarily formal) manner.
- Hands should be neat and clean and fingernails short.
- Hair should be in a conventional style, with long hair tied back so that it cannot hang down during examination or treatment.
- Please wear a clean shirt or blouse and your name at all times while in the clinic.
- Jewelry must be appropriate and discreet.
- No smoking in or near the clinic.
- Refrain from consuming alcohol or non-prescription drugs at any time during clinic practice days.

PATIENT COMFORT AND DIGNITY

At all times when you are with the patient, observe their comfort and dignity. Act and behave in a professional manner when observing/participating in their consultation and/or treatment. Never give advice or recommendations to patients unless directed to do so by your clinical professor.

Do not bring unnecessary food, drinks or personal items into the consultation or treatment rooms. Turn off cell phones, computers and other electronic devices. Never interrupt a consultation or treatment to talk to your professor, a colleague or a patient or to leave the room. In some circumstances, your professor may ask you to leave the room temporarily. Do so quickly and without agitation or protest.



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CONFIDENTIALITY

Case studies are confidential documents and there is a legal and ethical requirement that this confidentiality must always be respected. Never use the patient's name outside the consultation room and never discuss the case or the patient's condition except with other students and your professor, and only for learning purposes. Never discuss the patient outside the consultation or treatment room or in places where they can hear you or others.

GOVERNING LAW AND JURISDICTION

This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of Switzerland in every particular and shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts of Zurich cantonment. Venue for any claim or action related to, or arising out of, this agreement or the relationship between the parties shall be in Zurich, Switzerland.
